Only biodegradables belong in the Bio Bin!

The quantity of leftovers disposed of in the Bio Bin, particularly any containing fish and meat, should be kept to a minimum.

Do not dispose of biodegradables in plastic bags. Either wrap rubbish in news paper or use paper bags.



PLASTIC PACKAGING

- chocolate box inners
- disposable plates and plastic cutlery
- foil/plastic bags for pasta, crisps, etc.
- plastic bags
- polystyrene forms for fruit, eggs, etc.
- polystyrene pieces
- shampoo bottles, cooking oil bottles, etc.
- toothpaste tubes
- yoghurt pots, margarine tubs, etc.

COMBIPACKS

- milk and juice cartons
- soup sachets
- vacuum packaging for coffee

METAL PACKAGING

- aluminium foil, tops, dishes
- empty spray cans
- food and drink cans
- lids and caps
- toothpaste, mayonnaise, mustard tubes, etc.

Only to be used for Green

Point packaging!

The packaging must be empty, but not be cleaned.



- Non-returnable bottles used for vinegar, drinks, medicine, oil, etc.
- Non-returnable jars used for jam, preserves, mustard, cosmetics, etc.

Please dispose of glass at the bottle bank by colour (clear, green, brown)!

Blue, red or white coloured glass belongs into the green bottle bank.

Glass is also accepted at district recycling centres.
