Glass by Colour



- → ashes, cigarette butts
- → flower pots
- → sanitary towels
- → hosiery
- → paint/varnish (only hardened)
- → cigarette lighters
- → films/photos
- → light bulbs (mercury-free)
- → cat litter
- → sweepings
- → bones
- → ballpoint pens
- → leather
- → rags
- → felt-tip pens/ markers
- → medicines
- → plasters
- → plastic objects(no packaging)
- → porcelain/ceramic (only in small quantities)

Only biodegradables belong in the Bio Bin!

Do not dispose of biodegradables in plastic bags. Do not use any biodegradable plastic bags made of corn starch or similar!

Either wrap rubbish in newspaper or use paper bags.

Plastic packaging

- → yoghurt pots etc.
- → shampoo bottles, cooking oil bottles etc.
- → foil/plastic bags for pasta, crisps etc.
- → chocolate box inners
- → plastic bags (empty)
- → polystyrene pieces
- → polystyrene forms
- → polystyrene forms for eggs, fruits etc.
- → toothpaste tubes etc.

Combipacks

- → milk and juice cartons
- → soup sachets
- → vacuum packaging for coffee

Metal packaging

- → aluminium foil, tops, dishes
- → lids and caps
- → food and drink cans
- → empty spray cans
- → mayonnaise, mustard, toothpaste tubes, etc.

Use only for sales packaging (green point and other)!
The packaging must be empty, but not be cleaned.

- Empty non-returnable bottles used for drinks, vinegar and oil, medicine, etc.
- → Non-returnable jars used for preserves, cosmetics, jam, mustard, etc.

Please dispose of glass at the bottle bank by colour (clear, green, brown)! Blue, red or white coloured glass belongs into the green bottle bank.
